

2009 Taipei Summer Deaflympic Games

Great Britain Squad

Anthony Sinclair - Anthony is representing Great Britain in his third Deaflympics, having made his debut in the Games in Rome in 2001. In Melbourne in 2005 Anthony was a silver medallist in the men's singles, becoming Britain's first Deaflympic Games men's singles finalist for 40 years. Also in Melbourne Anthony won a Men's Doubles bronze medal with Darren O'Donnell.

Daniel Tunstall - Daniel will be representing Great Britain in his fourth successive Deaflympics, having made his Games debut in Copenhagen in 1997. Dan won a Mixed Doubles Bronze medal at the Rome Deaflympics in 2001 and the Melbourne Deaflympics in 2005 and will be hoping to medal in his third successive Deaflympics in Taipei.

Lewis Fletcher - Lewis is making Deaflympic Games debut for Great Britain in Taipei. He made his first major appearance for Great Britain at the 2003 Dresse Cup in Austria, the Davis Cup of Deaf Tennis, where Great Britain's Men were runners-up in the competition.

Darren O'Donnell - Darren is representing Great Britain in his second Deaflympics after winning a Men's Doubles bronze medal with Anthony Sinclair when making his Deaflympic Games debut in Melbourne in 2005. Also in Melbourne Darren reached the last 16 in the Men's Singles and the quarter-finals in the Mixed Doubles.

Jamie King - Jamie makes his Deaflympic Games debut for Great Britain in Taipei, having made tremendous progress as a young player in recent seasons. He graduated to National Deaf Senior Squad training in 2006.

Catherine Graham - Catherine is representing Great Britain in her fourth Deaflympics, having made her debut in the Games in Copenhagen, Denmark in 1997 at the age of 14. Catherine won bronze in the Women's Doubles at the 2005 Melbourne Deaflympics and she was also a semi-finalist in the Mixed Doubles and a quarterfinalist in the Women's Singles.
