Fixed-term for 2 years.

This is a part-time post working 23 hours per week throughout the year (0.63FTE). It requires flexibility in working hours to meet operational needs. Some evening and weekend work is required. The work is undertaken on the University campus and throughout the Stirlingshire area. There will be occasions when travel out with the local areas is required.

The Post

The University of Stirling, Scotland's University for Sporting Excellence, seeks an enthusiastic graduate to combine tennis development, co-ordination, leadership and coaching in a higher education setting whilst studying for a higher degree. The post is part-funded by the Tennis Foundation.

Primary responsibilities centre on the University of Stirling's position in promoting, supporting and developing a thriving tennis community structure throughout the Stirlingshire area. There is a particular focus on increasing junior and adult participation in schools and community sites, encouraging membership uptake at local tennis clubs and delivering a programme of recreationally-focused tennis competitions. The post-holder is required to animate, train and mobilise a student workforce to help deliver community tennis development. The post-holder will also support the enhancement of tennis activities delivered to our student tennis club. Close collaboration with our stakeholders including the Tennis Foundation; Tennis Scotland; and Stirling Council is an important feature of the role. The post-holder is expected to study part-time (2-years) for a postgraduate degree in a role-related academic discipline, the fees for which are paid for by the University's Sports Development Service.
